4. MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

- a. The department participated in 10,120 Training Man Hours. This represents 7.89% of on-duty time. Our goal would be to reach 10% (approx. 12,200 hours).
- b. The department experienced 2 accidents in 2014
 - i. Lakes Edge with E591
 - ii. The O2 cascade
- c. Lt. Carter is currently attending the Ohio Fire Executive (OFE) program. Lt. McFarland will begin this year. The department has 7 graduates of the program.
- d. Based on the budget spent for 2014, a resident of Violet Township pays \$0.55/day for our service (roughly \$201/year/resident).
- e. The tax valuation of Violet Township (\$999,383,820) is 30% of the total county tax valuation (\$3,370,579,500). Violet Township tax valuation is the highest in the county. Lancaster is next with nearly \$280,000,000 less tax valuation.
