



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
5. EMS & FIRE DISPATCH BY UNIT (ALL VEHICLES FROM CAD)




6. RESPONSE BY VEHICLE (FIRE & EMS FROM CAD)












14. RESPONSE BY DAY OF WEEK


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




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


15. RESPONSE BY DAY OF THE MONTH










16. RESPONSE BY MONTH OF YEAR


